

**Antibiotic Use  
in General Practice #2**

**CASE 1:** 3-year-old F/S indoor/outdoor cat who presents for fever and lethargy. An abscess is found on the rear on exam.

**CASE 2:** 2-year-old M Labrador who presents for a broken toenail. It occurs 3 days ago. The nail bed is swollen with yellow exudate. Otherwise acting normal.

**CASE 3:** 8-year-old M/N Yorkie presents for vomiting and diarrhea. Lethargic. Not eating and drinking. Tense on abdominal palpation.

**CASE 4:** 12-year-old fractious Female cat presents for drinking and peeing excessively. Had normal lab work 2 months prior.

**CASE 5:** 4-month-old M/N mixed breed dog. Rescued from the shelter 2 days ago. Coughing and hacking a lot. Eating and drinking well. Unknown vaccine history.

**CASE 6:** 7-year-old F/S DSH cat. Indoor only. Overgrooming the abdomen causing crusting and redness.

**CASE 7:** 8-week-old M puppy presents for diarrhea. Obtained from the breeder 3 days ago. Has received Pyrantel (Strongid) several times the past week.
